4. **Brief outline of program**

The STUDY LINK program offers a suite of short, self paced enabling subjects that are available by distance education. The subjects have been designed to address a considerable variety of topics and they have been found appropriate to meet the needs of first time university students. All materials are provided (usually online) within the scope of the program. The various STUDY LINK subjects are structured to involve between 15 and 40 hours of study; in most cases students work through the assessments at their own pace. All students have ongoing access to a subject coordinator who facilitates their progress through the subject and who can be contacted for assistance.

5. **Purpose/Aims**

The purpose of the STUDY LINK program is to enable students to make a seamless transition into university study, regardless of their background and entry level competence.

6. **Breadth of program**

The program is managed within the scope of activities under the auspices of the Dean of Studies, Academic support, and coexists with a number of other initiatives intended to enhance the progress of undergraduate students. The full range of 15 subjects is available to students at any stage of their transition into tertiary study from pre-entry to their final year; all subjects are accessible to students across the university. The availability of subjects is such that students can access most on a continuing basis throughout the year.

Formal evaluation of the STUDY LINK program was conducted in 2008 by Professor Andrys Onsman, Centre for the Advancement of Learning and Teaching, Monash University.
