- To provide high level reports on student retention and success to Access and Equity Reference Group.

- To support first and second year Arts/Education students in their university learning, in particular those of low socio economic background.
- To encourage students to continue with their studies by examining options.
- To offer a support structure for staff if they have student concerns.
