## 4. Brief outline of program

The Student Mentoring Program (SMP) provides students in their first session of study with access to a trained student mentor, who offers support, assistance and strategies to assist with the transition to university life and encourage development as self directed learners.

Student mentors assist and challenge 1<sup>st</sup> year students to enhance their skills and knowledge, to improve their opportunity for academic success and development as self directed learners. The SMP is available across all modes of study to students via face to face, online, video and telephone support utilising CSU available technologies.

- To enhance the student experience through the mentor support program and resources.
- To provide a framework for a positive and supportive environment for identified 1<sup>st</sup> year students.
- To provide opportunities for interaction between 1<sup>st</sup> year students and current students developing positive role models and passing on acquired knowledge.
- To strengthen the networks that supports the orientation of new students to the University culture, together with the services and programs available
- To enhance and support the retention and success rates of 1<sup>st</sup> year students.
- To develop and provide leadership and interpersonal development for mentors.
